Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA summer league with the Houston Rockets in the summer of 2006.

College Highlights: Earned Second Team All-Atlantic 10 as a senior. Also earned All-Philadelphia Big 5 honors and was named Philadelphia Big 5 Most Improved Player.

Senior (2005-06): Ranked second on the team in scoring (12.7 ppg), rebounding (5.0 rpg), and steals (39). Started all 32 games. Scored in double figures 23 times, with a season-high 24 points at Rutgers. Led team with 19 points vs. George Washington. Recorded only double-double of the season with 17 points and 11 rebounds vs. Alabama. Tallied 17 points, including the game-winning jumper, vs. Xavier. Scored 23 points vs. Rhode Island in the first round of the Atlantic 10 Tournament.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged 8.2 points and 4.5 rebounds. Led team in three-point field goal percentage (.349) and free throw percentage (.744). Started 29 of 30 games. Scored in double figures 14 times. Posted season-high 15 points vs. Dayton. Recorded two double-doubles, a 12-point, 12-rebound performance vs. Fordham, and a 15-point, ten rebound game vs. Duquesne. Tallied 11 points, seven rebounds, and a career-high four blocks at Maryland. Scored 13 points at Richmond.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 4.7 points and 4.5 rebounds in 25.5 minutes a contest. Started 25 of 26 games, missing three games due to an ankle injury. Scored in double figures three times, with a season-high of 11 points vs. Xavier and Massachusetts. Posted a double-double of ten points and ten rebounds vs. St. Bonaventure.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 5.4 points and 5.4 rebounds. Started first 21 games of the season before missing six games due to an ankle injury. Scored in double figures five times. Recorded season-high 17 points vs. Wake Forest. Pulled down a season-high 13 rebounds vs. Indiana and Massachusetts. Pulled down seven rebounds vs. Minnesota in the quarterfinals of the post-season NIT.

Personal: Majored in communications. Father, Eddie, played at Louisville from 1963-66. Favorite NBA team is the Los Angeles Lakers.
