Pro Career Highlights: Split the 2005-06 season between the Italian and Spanish LEB leagues. Started the year in Italy, averaging 10.9 points and 3.1 rebounds in seven games for Roseto Basket. Moved on to Calpe Aguas in the Spanish LEB league, averaging 13.4 points and 2.5 rebounds in ten games. Spent three seasons in the NBA, all with the New Jersey Nets. In 2003-04, averaged 2.7 points and 0.8 rebounds in 7.8 minutes a contest. In 2002-03, appeared in 17 games and averaged 1.4 points and 0.2 rebounds in 4.1 minutes a contest. As a rookie in 2001-02, played in 35 games averaging 1.8 points and 0.5 rebounds in 5.6 minutes a contest. Was traded from New Jersey to the Golden State Warriors prior to the 2004-05 season, but was released before playing a game.

College Highlights: An early entry candidate for the 2001 NBA Draft. Earned First Team All-West Coast Conference honors his sophomore and junior seasons. Finished collegiate career as Pepperdine's 21st all-time leading scorer with 1,175 career points. Started 64 of 65 career games.

Junior (2000-01): Led the WCC and ranked ninth nationally in scoring (22.1 points) while also averaging 3.3 rebounds, 1.5 assists, and 1.5 steals. Led the team in three-point field goal shooting (.384) and free throw shooting (.826). Season total of 684 points ranked as the fourth highest single season total in school history, and scoring average ranked sixth. Scored 20 or more points 18 times, and posted 30 or more in five contests. Exploded for career-high 40 points at Loyola Marymount. Tallied 33 points vs. St. Mary's. Registered 32 points vs. Gonzaga. Recorded a total of 56 points in Pepperdine's two contest in the post-season NIT vs. Wyoming and New Mexico.

Sophomore (1999-00): Averaged a team-high 14.4 points (third in the WCC), 3.2 rebounds, 1.5 assists, and 1.9 steals (second in the WCC). Led team and ranked second in the WCC in three-point field goal shooting (.400). Led team in scoring 17 times. Scored 20 or more points five times. Earned WCC All-Tournament honors after helping team reach the championship game. Led team with a season-high 22 points vs. Indiana in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. Registered 19 points vs. Oklahoma State in the second round.

Freshman (1998-99): Sat out as a partial qualifier under NCAA rules.
