Pro Career Highlights: Participated in NBA training camp with the Atlanta Hawks in the fall of 2006. Spent the 2005-06 season in South Korea with the Daegu Orions and the Incheon ET Land Black Slamer (statistics unavailable). Participated in NBA summer league with the Seattle Sonics in the summer of 2005. Also played in the Philippines in the summer of 2005, averaging 24.4 points and 13.3 rebounds in seven games with the Barangay Ginebra Kings. Participated in NBA training camp with the New Jersey Nets in the fall of 2004. Moved on to play in Italy with Euro Roseto, averaging 9.9 points and 6.4 rebounds in 12 games. Moved on to play with BC Buducnost Podgorica in the Adriatic League, averaging 8.7 points and 5.3 rebounds in seven games.

College Highlights: Named Second Team All-Conference USA by the league coaches as a senior. Finished collegiate career ranked fourth in Conference USA history with 855 rebounds. Ranks eighth in DePaul history in rebounds, 10th in minutes played, 13th in blocked shots (70), 14th in rebounding average (8.0 rpg), tied for 16th in field goal percentage (.502), 25th in games played (107) and 28th in scoring (1,146 points). One of only eight players in school history to have 1,000 points and 800 rebounds in a career. Posted 28 career double-doubles. Holds the C-USA single-game record with 27 rebounds (vs. TCU as a sophomore).

Senior (2003-04): Averaged 13.5 points and a team-high 9.2 rebounds. Ranked among C-USA leaders in field goal percentage (12th) and scoring (23rd). Started all 23 games played. Set career-high with 24 points and added 12 rebounds vs. Tulane. Tied career-high with 24 points and three blocks vs. Southern Miss. Pulled down season-high 14 rebounds vs. Bradley. Named to the All-Tournament team at the Spartan Coca-Cola Classic.

Junior (2002-03): Averaged 9.4 points while finishing fourth in C-USA in rebounding (9.0 rpg). Started 18 of 28 games. Posted a double-double with a game-high 20 points and 11 rebounds vs. UNLV. Selected to the Preseason All-Conference USA team (coaches). Registered a season-high 20 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against UNLV. Posted 15 points and 12 rebounds at Notre Dame. Tallied 15 points and a game-high 16 rebounds at North Carolina in the NIT.

Sophomore (2001-02): Became the first DePaul player since 1988-89 (Stanley Brundy) to lead the team in scoring, rebounding, field goal percentage and blocked shots. Ranked among Conference USA leaders for rebounding (second), scoring (13th) and field goal percentage (14th). Started 25 of 26 games. Scored season-high 24 points and grabbed seven rebounds vs. Fairfield. Posted 21 points and eight rebounds at Cincinnati. Led team with 21 points at Memphis. Set a C-USA single game record with 27 rebounds at TCU, which was the second-best single-game total in DePaul history.

Freshman (2000-01): Averaged 6.5 points and 4.9 rebounds in 22.6 minutes a contest. Started six times. Posted season-high 19 points and eight rebounds at Marquette. Recorded 18 points and 11 rebounds in his collegiate debut against Lewis, joining Imari Sawyer as the first DePaul newcomers since 1992 to have a double-double in their first collegiate game.
