College Highlights: Finished collegiate career at Nevada after playing first two seasons at New Mexico. Sat out the 2003-04 season at Nevada under NCAA transfer rules.

Senior (2004-05): Averaged 2.6 points, 2.9 rebounds, and 0.6 blocked shots in 19.7 minutes a contest. Started 15 of 33 games. Posted season-highs of 11 points and seven rebounds vs. Sacramento State in the season opener. Tallied six points and four rebounds in 17 minutes vs. Utah State. Blocked a season-high three shots in the first round of the WAC Tournament vs. Idaho. Matched that high with three blocks and also pulled down six rebounds vs. Montana in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Junior (2003-04): Averaged 3.0 points, 2.8 rebounds, and 0.7 blocked shots in 14.0 minutes a contest. Came off the bench in all 32 games. Recorded career-high 12 points on 5-for-5 shooting vs. Rice. Tallied nine points and eight rebounds in 16 minutes vs. Boise State. Registered a career-high four blocked shots and grabbed seven rebounds vs. Tulsa. Scored ten points vs. Boise State in the first round of the WAC Tournament.

Sophomore (2002-03): Averaged 1.5 points, 1.6 rebounds, and 0.9 blocked shots in 10.9 minutes a contest. Started six times. Scored season-high six points twice, vs. Portland State and at Utah. Posted season highs of four rebounds and four blocked shots vs. New Mexico State.

Freshman (2001-02): Averaged 3.1 points, 2.1 rebounds, and 1.3 blocked shots in 17.5 minutes a contest. Led team and ranked third in the Mountain West Conference in blocked shots. Started 13 times. Posted season-high ten points vs. Tennessee Tech. Registered season-high four blocks three times, vs. Stanford, New Mexico State, and UNC-Greensboro.
