College Highlights: Earned Fiesta Bowl Classic All-Tournament Team honors his junior and senior seasons. Started 24 of 119 career games. Originally an early entry candidate for the 2005 NBA Draft before withdrawing his name from consideration.

Senior (2005-06): Averaged 8.9 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 1.6 assists in 26.9 minutes a contest. Started 15 of 25 games, missing eight contests after being briefly dismissed from the team in January. Scored in double figures 12 times. Posted season-high of 20 points twice, in consecutive games vs. Michigan State in the Maui Invitational and vs. Virginia. Scored 19 points in consecutive games vs. Sam Houston State and Western Kentucky. Tallied 12 points and five steals vs. UCLA. Recorded 12 points and five steals vs. Stanford in the first round of the Pac-10 Tournament.

Junior (2004-05): Averaged 5.5 points, 2.1 rebounds, and 2.1 assists in 19.1 minutes a contest. Led team in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.3). Ranked second on the team in steals (2.2 spg). Started four times. Scored in double figures seven times. Registered a career-high 22 points vs. Southern Cal. Tallied 20 points, a career-high seven rebounds, four assists, and three steals vs. Richmond. Posted 16 points and six rebounds at Marquette. Scored 11 points and dished out a career-high nine assists vs. Oregon. Scored ten points in 13 minutes vs. Utah State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Sophomore (2003-04): Averaged 8.6 points, 2.3 rebounds, and 2.0 assists in 23.8 minutes a contest. Ranked sixth in the Pac-10 in three-point shooting percentage (.422). Started five times. Scored in double figures 12 times, hitting a season-high of 20 points on 8-for-10 shooting vs. Arizona State in the regular season finale. Scored 17 points vs. Florida. Posted 12 points and a season-high seven assists vs. Oregon State. Shot 4-for-9 from beyond the three-point arc in scoring 16 points vs. UCLA.

Freshman (2002-03): Averaged 2.5 points, 0.9 rebounds, and 1.0 assists in 8.3 minutes a contest. Scored a season-high 14 points vs. Davidson, his only double-figure scoring output of the season. Posted Pac-10 scoring high of seven points vs. UCLA and Oregon State.
