Pro Career Highlights: Played for BK Livulius/Liepaja in Latvia in 2005-06. Appeared in 20 games in the Baltic League, averaging 13.6 points and 9.0 rebounds, and two games in the Latvian League, averaging 2.0 points and 1.5 rebounds. Played for Soles de Mexicali in the Mexican LNBP League in the summer of 2005, averaging 8.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in 11 games. Spent the 2004-05 season in Argentina and Lithuania. Started the year with Obras Sanitarias Buenos Aires in Argentina, averaging 7.0 points and 5.1 rebounds in 13 games, and moved on to Panevezys Aukstaitija in Lithuania, averaging 17.6 points and 13.4 rebounds in the Baltic League, and 7.3 points and 5.7 rebounds in three games in the Lithuanian League. Played in the USBL in the summer of 2004 with the Brooklyn Kings, averaging 2.5 points and 2.5 rebounds in four games. Spent the 2003-04 season in the ABA with the Trenton Jersey Squires and Fresno Heat Wave (statistics unavailable). Played in the USBL in the summer of 2002 with the Brooklyn Kings, averaging 5.2 points and 6.5 rebounds in 14 games.

College Highlights: Played in 107 career games. Finished career shooting just shy of 50 percent from the field, at .498 (356-for-715), fourth all-time in Fordham history. Led team in blocked shots final three seasons.

Senior (2001-02): Averaged 7.2 points and 6.8 rebounds. Started 17 of 24 games. Missed four games in February due to a sprained left ankle. Rebounding average was eighth best in the Atlantic-10, and team-leading 21 blocked shots ranked eighth in the conference. Scored season-high 21 points on 7-for-12 field goal shooting, adding 12 rebounds against Siena. Notched double-double with 13 points and season-high 15 rebounds while blocking three shots against George Washington. Registered double-double with 15 point, 15 rebound performance against Massachusetts.

Junior (2000-01): Averaged 10.5 points and 6.9 rebounds. Started 21 of 28 games. Ranked second on the team and eighth in the Atlantic-10 in rebounding. Had six double-doubles on the season. Scored season-high 26 points and grabbed 11 rebounds against Iona. Tallied 18 points and 13 rebounds at Manhattan. Netted 15 points and pulled down 11 rebounds against Xavier.

Sophomore (1999-00): Averaged 11.0 points and 8.0 rebounds. Started six of 29 games. Ranked third in the Atlantic-10 in rebounding. Shot a team-high .551 from the field. Had seven double-double efforts on the season. Had a career high night in scoring and rebounding by registering a 28 point, 20 rebound double-double against George Washington. Followed up that effort with a 13 point, 19 rebound double-double against Rhode Island. Named the Atlantic-10 Most Improved Player.

Freshman (1998-99): Averaged 3.0 points and 2.5 rebounds in just over 10 minutes a game. Started three times in 26 games. Scored season-high 10 points and grabbed four rebounds in six minutes at La Salle on Feb. 10. Pulled in season-high 10 rebounds against Holy Cross. Recorded seven points and three blocked shots in his collegiate debut against Boston College.
