Pro Career Highlights: Has mainly played in Mexico the past few seasons. In 2006, averaged 18.0 points in ten games for Trigueros Ciudad Obregon. In 2005 in the Mexican LNBP for Fuerza Regia Monterey, averaged 21.9 points, 5.0 rebounds, and 4.0 assists in 29 games. In the 2004-05 season, started the year with the Denver Truckers in the NABL before moving on to play for AZS Zagaz Koszalin in Poland, averaging 11.7 points and 4.3 rebounds in 11 games. Played for Santos de San Luis Potosi in the Mexican LNBP in 2003 and 2004. In the summer of 2002, played with the St. Louis Skyhawks in the USBL, averaging 2.4 points and 1.0 rebounds.

College Highlights: Named Honorable Mention All-Lone Star Conference as a senior. Ranks as the second all-time leader in blocked shots (63) in Angelo State history, in only one season. Finished collegiate career at Angelo State after playing first two seasons at Lamar Community College in Colorado and one season at Portland State.

Senior (2001-02): Averaged 10.3 points, 5.6 rebounds, and 2.2 blocked shots in 21.4 minutes a contest. Season total of 63 blocked shots ranks third all-time in school history. Led team in field goal percentage (.589) and steals (48). Played in 29 games, starting five. Recorded a career-high seven blocked shots vs. Texas A&M-Kingsville, tied for the second-best single game mark in school history.

Junior (2000-01): At Portland State, averaged 5.9 points, 3.3 rebounds, and 1.2 blocked shots in 19.9 minutes a contest. Started 17 of 27 games. Scored in double figures five times. Registered season-high 23 points at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. Recorded a double-double of 11 points and ten rebounds vs. Boise State. Scored 14 points and grabbed seven rebounds at Washington. Dished out a season-high seven assists at Loyola Marymount. Posted a season-high four blocked shots at Weber State.

Sophomore (1999-00): At Lamar CC, averaged 15.7 points, 5.5 rebounds, and 3.5 assists.

Freshman (1998-99): Averaged seven points and three rebounds.
